### 7:05 Guests and Elected Officials (60 min)

- 30 min Hendri Carpio (CPS) and Inspector Gomez
  - Jose Gomez in 3rd precinct inspector (largest precinct in city)
  - Hendri Carpio Crime Prevention Specialist covers 6 neighborhoods including Standish
    (Jennifer covers Ericsson), can do a free walkthrough of a house or business
  - How many officers in 3rd precinct? Patrol Officers roughly 60 in the precinct was at 120 so at half staff right now, there are 4 sectors with 2 officers per sector and a precinct wide car at all times, plus a M-F day officer, supplementing with overtime for Lake Street, Franklin Ave, and Little Earth, do have a limit on the overtime to keep officers mental health okay
  - Need to get 772 officers for the city but used to have 880 officers, so it would be closer
  - Do coordinate with metro transit and private security around specific locations
  - Still housed in city of lakes building downtown, moving in 2026 to the Minnehaha property that is being designed by Wold Architects, will also house Southside Community Center services
  - The number one thing to do to help with crime is relay information to MPD, report of property damage will be a low priority but should still report online and video really helps
  - Starting a block text thread or something like that to keep a conversation going about anything you are seeing
  - Some neighborhoods have walking groups that do patrols
  - Neighbors feel like businesses are being prioritized over residential properties
  - MPD is switching to encrypted radios
  - The officers sitting outside of businesses are off duty, which isn't controlled by MPD
  - The real shortage is getting applicants to apply to open officer positions, not funding
    - Could there be an expansion of crime prevention specialists to do things like reporting but that has difficulties funding, maybe could do it with community specialists like is done in the suburbs
  - Invite officers to community events and they will try to come
  - Can there be home security books supplied for free at hardware stores?
  - o Would also like to see narcan trainings freely available more
  - Residential block leaders are private list but we can advocate to get access
  - Touch Outreach and Mad Dads are our areas violent interrupter groups
  - The car thefts might feel extreme but we are at 27 a week versus 99 a week in 2023
  - Victim impact statements help a lot in sentencing

- Juvenile youth curfew program sends people to talk to parents on the weekend nights to see if the child is home
- 20 min City Councilmember Aurin Chowdhury (if available)
  - City has increased civilian investigators with a budget amendment for 5 roles
    - Reach out to the Mayor also if you want more investigators and copy Aurin
  - Violence prevention and violence interrupters groups have been looking at metrics to see if they are successful
